Minutes

Welcome & Introductions.

- Roll Call Type your name and club into the Chat Box. Open mic roll call with the question "What
 are you doing to prepare for live meetings in 2021?"
 - Some clubs have already started to meet live with members observe the mask rule and
 distancing. Others will begin meeting in May and June unless there is a change in CDC
 recommendations. With vaccinated members and observances of the CDC recommendations, it
 is considered safe to begin activities that allow members to meet in person and teams to work
 together. Most clubs are scheduling events outside or in large open spaces that allow for safe
 meetings.

Big Needs (Requested by Carol Grainger):

Presidents Memorial list for each club. MGC will be doing a memorial slideshow during the MGC
 Annual Conference. They are asking for a complete list of members who have passed away since our

last live conference in 2019. They would like the following information: Name, Date of Death and Club Name (image is optional).

- Presidents are asked to consider submitting names of potential members who could serve on MGC's Nominating Committee. We need to 2 members from our District. It is not confirmed that we have Jean Goetz on the Committee.
- Delegates (Delegates by proxy). Every club is entitled to 2 voting delegates for the MGC Annual
 Conference. If the Club has more than 50 members, they get 1 additional delegate per 50 members.
 The call for delegates was sent out by David Drain and needs to be submitted by May 1, 2021. If a
 club cannot be represented at the MGC Conference, then it may assign its delegate spots to another
 club by completing a voting by proxy. The MGC elects officers and votes on bylaw changes and will
 need a quorum to accept the budget, approve bylaw changes and elect officers on June 2, 2021.
- Committee for MGC Annual Conference in June 2022 (MGC + D2B committee members work together). This is something to be thinking about and find members from each club to take a part in the planning and hosting of this event. More on this in future meetings.
- Youth Programs A communications leader for the District to help Ronnie Dush. Carol G asks for a
 point person from each club, if they have members working on any projects involving youth. There
 are some questions on how we safely work with children and still support programs that involve them.
 We want to continue exchanging ideas on how others are managing their programs and how we
 model after the best practices.
- Future President's Meetings: Carol G proposed that future President's meetings be moved to an earlier time to immediately follow the Steering Committee meetings. The Steering Committee decided to move their meetings to 3:30 (to accommodate a one-hour time frame) and then those on the SC that wish to join in on the President's meeting could take a 15–30-minute break and then join in on the 5:00 6:00 (or possibly 6:30) meeting. Most agreed to that arrangement and Wendy Turner said she may be just a little late because of her work schedule. The May meeting will be moved to the new time frame.

- Club Rosters Janet Hickman said that the Rosters with instructions will be going out in May to District
 Directors. From there, the District Director will send them out to each club's roster manager. Since many
 clubs will have officer changes, it is important to pass this responsibility on to the next President (or roster
 manager) to make sure the membership updates are completed.
- Send Club brochures and marketing materials to DD (e-files or paper) for central library/document collection. Carol asks to have clubs send in (paper or electronic) any club brochure or marketing piece to

keep on file in the District document library. The electronic versions could be stored on the Club's page (on the D2B Weebly site).

This is a great resource for members in our District to find information about other clubs.  - There was some discussion on platform, design software and hosting options for building a website. Some recommendations were made, and Ronnie Polad said that she would be open to assist others on getting website pages started.
- ZOOM training Clubs that still need help on Zoom, please contact C. Grainger. Help each other and feel free to hold your committee meetings and practice. The Zoom tech training series is over but if you need help, there are some tutorials that can be viewed. Going forward, even with live, face-to-face meetings, Zoom is still a great tool to meet. The usefulness of Zoom will not go away. Each club should appoint 2 people in their club to be the Zoom account managers. They can be trained and given the log-in information. Laura G. said that she is available to help people figure it out and if you are stuck, give me a call or shoot her an email for help.
- Technology options are available to clubs that are 501(c)(3). Many software and internet services are heavily discounted or free to us through TechSoup. If you have not registered with TechSoup and are looking for technology options, check it out. Clubs that are not with the MGC GTEP program can work with Rose Houk to get registered.
- There was some discussion on Bylaws and how they specify what a quorum is. Rose reminded Presidents to read their Bylaws and the Roberts Rules of Order to make sure voting is done according to rule.
- Newsletter deadline for next publication. We need your articles and calendars for May's issue. Deadline is May 1, 2021 for Presidents to send anything that they want published. Events, fundraisers, or general club newsworthy information or article can be included. We are giving each club a section in the newsletter. Publishing will be completed by May 15th and distributed by May 17th.
