

Our 2018 Standard Flower Show "We Love Michigan" was held at the Michigan State Pavilion March 15-18. We displayed 214 pieces of horticulture, 48 floral designs, 12 Botanical Arts exhibits, and 4 educational exhibits. Winners of the top awards are listed on the next page.

We plan to give the **Marilyn J. Lee award** at both the Spring and Fall 2018 District IIB Meetings, and the application form is posted on the District IIB website. This club award is for civic beautification projects.

The Spring 2018 District Meeting, April 18th, will feature a Horticulture Specialty Flower Show "Bee Ready for Spring." April 18th will be a wonderful time to feature daffodils, tulips, and other cut spring flowers from those bulbs you planted last fall (or years ago). Bottles for your cut specimens will be available near the registration desk.

Webberville Garden Club Hosts Event for Children





MGC displayed the Black Swallowtail Butterfly display at the Show Span Home and Garden Show in March.





Feedback was positive. Many people were surprised that Michigan is one of only three states that does not have a state butterfly. "Why Not?" was a frequent question.

We gathered 491 signatures in support of Senate Bill 298 and sold \$170 worth of Black Swallowtail pins! Our Black Swallowtail brochures, plant "shopping list" bookmarks, coloring sheets and butterfly fans for children were given away and enthusiastically received.
