The Grand Ledge Garden Club





We are carrying on their vision as our club is celebrating 77 years of service to the beautiful City of Grand Ledge. Our 2018 club membership consists of 32 members. Many projects have been completed through the years, and we are still honoring three yearly traditions:



 1959-The Hanging of the Greens in the Grand Ledge District Library. This entails decorating the library for the Christmas Holiday with a new theme each year, and a Christmas tree that can be seen from the street for all to enjoy throughout the Holiday Season.

• 1981- The Memorial Tree Project has been a stellar success for 27 years. With the 13 trees donated this year, our total is 425 trees planted throughout the City of Grand Ledge. The Dedication Ceremony is always well attended and done with excellence, from the speakers, the music, and not to forget, the wonderful desserts. This year the GLGC donated a wonderful bench on the walking trail for resting and reflecting.

• 1984-The Geranium Flower Sale began as a fundraiser for restoration and landscaping of the Grand Ledge Opera House, Lincoln Brick Park, Library, and City Hall. The geranium is our Club Flower and Grand Ledge is known as 'The Geranium City.' This is the club's only fund raiser and proves to be a great success year after year. It is a collaborative effort of all club members from sales, unloading, and filling the orders for over 3000 multicolored geraniums plants.

Silent auction proceeds exceeded \$1,100, which will help produce a sizeable surplus to be shared among Brighton Garden Club, MGC, and District IIB after the remaining event bills are paid. Thanks to the silent auction bidders, there will be more funds available for club grants.

I'm encouraging clubs that need extra funds to finance special projects to check into Grow and Share grants. They are available up to \$200 for qualifying projects. You can find information on qualifying project purposes and approval criteria, along with the forms for application and final report, on the District website (password 2bgardeners). To apply, just complete the application and submit it to the IIB District Director. If approved, the application will be forwarded to the MGC Grants chair for review. If approved by the MGC Grants Committee, the District will issue the funds. When the project is completed, the club submits a final report.




IIB Quilters




ing and her leadership abilities have been reflective throughout our club projects and busi-

mittee, she is responsible for selling memorial plaques for each of the 32 planters. The money from these markers offset the cost of the plants & soil. Janice also organizes teams of members and community volunteers that maintain these planters all summer long. In the fall, the planters are taken down, emptied and stored for next spring.

Janice has always extended her helping hands and knowhow into our community projects and activities. Best of all, she is open-minded and eager to learn new things, expanding her knowledge of landscaping design, conservation, preservation, and horticulture. Janice also makes beautiful bouquets, and artsy-crafty projects.



We will be holding our annual **Greens Market** on Saturday December 1st. This is our largest and oldest program, which started in 1934. Fresh greens are made into decorated wreaths, swags, boxwood trees and arrangements and are offered to the public.

This sale is our only fund raiser each year. All members are involved; we have workshops beginning in mid-November to make the products that we sell. The Greens Market is never far from the minds of some members as we have summer workshops, order truck-loads of fresh greens, plan and shop for supplies, plan advertising and other details. Of course members need to refresh our techniques each year, but the result is well

worth the trouble as we see potential shoppers lined up waiting for the Market door to open.

The Greens market profits help us to provide philanthropic donations to a number of area programs and organizations. Currently our recipients are: Woldumar Nature Center -Camp Discovery; The Garden Project-Lansing Food Bank; Fenner Nature Center; Hunter Park Garden House-Youth Service Corps.; Loda Lake; Michigan Garden Clubs, Inc.
