





Boxwood blight is detected in Michigan

Boxwood blight, a serious fungal disease that attacks boxwoods, has been detected for the first time in Michigan. The disease was found in Oakland County in three separate locations: a landscape firm, a homeowner's yard, and holiday wreaths for sale at a retail store. The Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development (MDARD) was also notified by the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection that infected boxwood may have been sold at other retail locations in Michigan.



"Boxwood blight is a devastating disease that has caused significant losses

to homeowners and the nursery industry in states that already have the disease," said Gina Alessandri, director of MDARD's Pesticide and Plant Pest Management Division.

Protecting Bees



Various groups have published bee-friendly plant lists, but these lists often lack experimental data and rarely emphasize woody plants (flowering trees and shrubs)— a major component of urban landscapes.

Two researchers at the University of Kentucky set out to document which woody plants attracted bees in urban areas, and after countless hours of field work they published their results. You can access their easily-searchable database, selecting a

variety of criteria specific to the conditions where you wish to plant. Click <u>here</u> to access this data base and other useful information generated from their research.


