 - Lois Snover Hansen would like to be included in the program to talk about the District's Spring Show. She would like to show some artistic examples for the Spring Show.
 - Carol said that the District should consider a Horticulture Show at the Fall Meeting. This is to be investigated.

Ronnie explained that once you have POSTED something to the 2B Facebook page and Ronnie has approved your posting, your future posts will be accepted.
